



Wisconsin's Spring 2026 Elections What's at Stake?

The Justice elected to the **Wisconsin Supreme Court** on April 7 might be the one with the deciding opinion on issues impacting our rights and the state of our democracy.

- **Workers' Rights**
 - Overturning Act 10 and restoring the right of educators to bargain with employers on salary, working conditions, and health & safety.
- **Voting Rights**
 - Maintaining and expanding voting rights that are often under attack, including early voting, absentee voting, and general access to the ballot.
 - Maintaining the Fair Maps the court put into place before the 2024 fall elections.
- **Women's Rights**
 - Maintaining women's healthcare rights as more laws are pushed in federal and state legislatures that limit rights.
- **School Funding**
 - The state's Constitution requires state government to adequately fund public schools
- **Separation of Powers**
 - Maintaining the balance in decision-making authority between the governor's office and the Legislature so the Legislature can't operate unchecked.
- **Securing the Future**
 - Electing a justice in 2026 who supports the values public school educators support could ensure a pro-public-education majority on the Supreme Court for the next 10 years.

- Educator friendly school board members make a difference by working with our members on issues that affect them and their students.
- Referendums are crucial as communities are forced to address the funding gap as the state spends less and less on public schools.
